Then we all went to the Claro Lounge for a cosy or Baltic drink and then we also had some cake which was "yummy in my tummy".


We also went to restock the shelf with some extra books; we all took turns restocking the shelves.

I really enjoyed my day because I couldn't stop talking about it all week and I was very excited because I was going out with the book wrapping group.


The weather was a bit overcast, cold and sunny.








Cumbria Life

What your favourite music to listen to?


80s music, Capital FM and YO1 radio stations.

What's your favourite thing to do on a weekend?


I go to Leeds on the bus and enjoy looking around the shops.























Cooks Corner

This months recipe is a Roast Dinner. Sam has taken inspiration the BBC Good Food website for his recipes.



Sam asked some of the workers and staff what their favourite roast dinner was and what they like with it.

Sam – Pork, roast potatoes, Yorkshire puddings

Anna – Lamb shank, roast potatoes, mint sauce

Avril - A mix of gammon and turkey, dauphinoise potatoes, red cabbage

Phoebe - Beef, gravy, all vegetables

Phe (v) – Just vegetables. no gravy

William - I don't really like it

Yorkshire Pudding Recipe

The secret to getting glorious puffed-up Yorkshire puddings is to get the fat sizzling hot and don't open the oven door.

Ingredients

140g plain flour4 eggs200ml milkSun flower for cooking

Method

Step 1

Heat oven to 230C/fan 210C/gas 8.

Step 2

Drizzle a little sunflower oil into two 4-hole Yorkshire pudding trays or two 12 - hole non-stick muffin tins and place in the oven to heat through.

Step 3

To make the batter, tip 140g plain flour into a bowl and beat in 4 eggs until smooth.

Step 4

Gradually add 200ml milk and carry on beating until the mix is completely lump free. Season with salt and pepper.

Step 5

Pour the batter into a jug, then remove the hot tins from the oven. Carefully and evenly pour the batter into the holes.

Step 6

Place the tins back in the oven and leave undisturbed for 20-25 mins until the puddings have puffed up and browned.

Step 7

Serve immediately.

You can now cool them and freeze for up to 1 month.



ROAST POTATOES

Make sure your oil is hot before putting the potatoes in the oven.

Ingredients

1kg Maris piper potatoes 100g duck or goose fat 2 tsp flour Sea salt flakes

METHOD

Step 1

Put a roasting tin in the oven (one big enough to take the potatoes in a single layer) and heat oven to 200/ fan 180C/gas 6

Step 2

Peel 1kg potatoes and cut each into 4 even -sized pieces if they are medium size, 2–3 if smaller (5cm pieces).

Step 3

Drop the potatoes into a large pan and pour in enough water to barely cover them.

Step 4

Add salt, then wait for the water to boil. As soon as the water reaches a full rolling boil, lower the heat, put your timer on and simmer the potatoes uncovered, reasonably vigorously, for 2 mins.

Step 5

Meanwhile, put 100g duck or goose fat or 100ml olive oil into the hot roasting tin and heat it in the oven for a few minutes, so it's really hot.

Step 6

Drain the potatoes in a colinder, then shake the colander back and forth a few times to fluff up the outsides.

Step 7

Sprinkle with 2 tsp of flour and give another shake or two so they are evenly coated.

Step 8

Carefully put the potatoes into the hot fat, they will sizzle as you put them in. Then turn the potatoes so they are coated all over.

Step 9

Spread them in a single layer making sure they have plenty of room.












