

We painted some lovely spring flowers with them. It was lovely to sit and chat with them whilst enjoying painting.










Bedale Dogfest




Duncombe Park

happy with my bowl." – Jamie A



Bird Box Building Experience

Looking for an original gift idea? How about a Bird Box Building Experience at Jennyruth Workshops?



Choose which style of bird box you want to make

Tit Box



Robin Box



Blackbird Box



... and decorate it using a range of stencils in colours of your choice.



We'll provide component parts, materials, tools and tuition - along with a sandwich lunch. Your unique bird box will be finished and ready to take home by 4pm

The day will include a tour of our workshop, as well as assembling and decorating your own bird box to take home.

Arriving at 10am, your experience will start with a hot drink and safety briefing. This will be followed by a tour of our workshop where you'll meet our 'workers', one of whom will show you around and guide you through the process of creating your own bird box.

Then it's off to the woodwork area where you'll sand the wooden components of your bird box, drill and screw the box together, assemble and fit the roof. You'll add finishing touches: roofing felt, a hanging hook, and one of our trademark wrens.

After lunch you'll move on to the paint shop where you'll be able to stencil on decorations to make your bird box truly unique.

This experience is suitable for adults aged 18+.

The cost of £99 per person includes all you'll need to make your bird box and will help support our workshop. Experiences are available Monday to Friday 10am-4pm. All materials, tools and safety boots will be supplied for the day.

The experience is for one person to attend. It is possible to book 2 experiences so that 2 people (max.) can attend together, each making their own box. Please contact us to enquire about similar experiences for larger groups.

Our workshop is near Ripon HG4 5AY. Parking on site.





Cooks Corner

Cooks Corner is here to bring you delicious recipes made by Tuesday morning's group! Back by popular demand..this month's favourite recipe is delicious Cheese and Herb Bread.

Ingredients

8oz Self Raising Flour
Pinch of Salt
loz Margarine
4oz Grated Red Leicester Cheese
Itblsp Chopped Mixed Herbs
1 Egg
1/4 Pint Milk



STEP 1

Set the oven to gas mark 5/375' and line a 1lb loaf tin with grease proof paper.

STEP 2

Put flour, salt and pepper into a bowl and add the margarine. Rub in using finger tips only.

STEP 3

Stir in cheese and herbs.

STEP 4

Beat the egg and milk together.

STEP 5

Add the egg and milk mixture to the flour and margarine mixture and stir until you have a stiff batter. You may need an extra drop or two of milk.

STEP 6

Put the mixture into the lined loaf tin and bake for 40–45mins until golden brown on top.

The event was full of people who had come out to support our charity and we raised a huge amount of money!

The following day Tom ran the Melmerby

10K and in doing so raised a large amount of
money for the workshops.

"On Sunday 5th May, after months of training and hard work from my PT Richard, the day had dawned on me running the 10K.

Unfortunately due to illness, Richard my PT could not run with me. So my dad stepped in and took Richard's place.

On the morning of the run, my dad and I went to get our race number and give my medical details to the organisers. My mum, Emma and my sister, Katie went to Marshall at Wath. My dad and I lined up and waited for the run to begin. The weather started off being cooler but then warmed up, I felt comfortable up to the 4k mark. I can normally cope with running 3.1 miles every week at Park Run.

After 4K my legs started struggling. At 8K, I hit the wall at Sutton Hargrave. I began to think about some of the workers at Jennyruth Workshops who could not run a 10K distance. This spurred me on to complete the last 2k of the run.

There was a roaring applause from my family and my best friend Emma as I ran across the finish line. I completed the run in 1 hour, 7 minutes and 58 seconds."


