Trip to Ripon Wetlands


The sun was shining so we decided to visit Ripon Wetlands. We were able to take the minibus all the the way in which was great.

All in all it was a very popular day and Shaun would recommend it.





Even the elephants had armour.






After months and months of work and patience, we are very excited to announce the near completion of our extension!

Celebrations and Grand Opening announcements to come once the finishing touches are complete...


