
- For superb packaging skills taking his time when labelling products and not being fazed when using the laminator and guillotine for the first time.

### Bird Box Building Experience

# Looking for an original gift idea? How about a Bird Box Building Experience at Jennyruth Workshops?



Choose which style of bird box you want to make ....

Tit Box



**Robin Box** 



**Blackbird Box** 



... and decorate it using a range of stencils in colours of your choice.



We'll provide component parts, materials, tools and tuition - along with a sandwich lunch. Your unique bird box will be finished and ready to take home by 4pm

The day will include a tour of our workshop, as well as assembling and decorating your own bird box to take home.

Arriving at 10am, your experience will start with a hot drink and safety briefing. This will be followed by a tour of our workshop where you'll meet our 'workers', one of whom will show you around and guide you through the process of creating your own bird box.

Then it's off to the woodwork area where you'll sand the wooden components of your bird box, drill and screw the box together, assemble and fit the roof. You'll add finishing touches: roofing felt, a hanging hook, and one of our trademark wrens.

After lunch you'll move on to the paint shop where you'll be able to stencil on decorations to make your bird box truly unique.

This experience is suitable for adults aged 18+.

The cost of £99 per person includes all you'll need to make your bird box and will help support our workshop. Experiences are available Monday to Friday 10am-4pm. All materials, tools and safety boots will be supplied for the day.

The experience is for one person to attend. It is possible to book 2 experiences so that 2 people (max.) can attend together, each making their own box. Please contact us to enquire about similar experiences for larger groups.

Our workshop is near Ripon HG4 5AY. Parking on site.

Additional personalisation options (e.g. name plaque, bespoke cut outs or stencils, ...) can be pre-booked at an additional cost.



# Baking Bonanza

Our Wednesday afternoon Baking Group having been creating the most delicious treats this month!





### Cooks Corner

Cooks Corner is back and here to bring you delicious recipes made by Tuesday morning's group! This month's favourite recipe was 'BBC Good Food's' yummy heartwarming lasagne.

#### Ingredients for the sauce

Olive Oil

1 Onion, finally chopped

1 Carrot, chopped

2 Celery Sticks, chopped

1 Bay Leaf

3 Garlic Cloves, crushed

500g Beef Mince

2 tsp Tomato Purée

125ml Red Wine

400g Chopped Tomatoes

400–500ml Beef Stock
Sea Salt and Black Pepper

#### Ingredients for the Béchamel sauce

75g Unsalted Butter
75g Plain Flour
1 Litre Full Fat Milk
1/4 tsp Freshly Ground Nutmeg

#### To assemble

250–300g Dried lasagne sheets 150g Parmesan



#### STEP 1

For the sauce, heat a heavy-based saucepan over a medium-high heat. Once hot, add a glug of oil and then add the onion, carrots, celery and bay leaf and cook for 5-6 minutes or until softened. Add the garlic and carry on cooking for two minutes.

#### STEP 2

Turn the heat up and add the mince to the pan and continue to fry breaking up any large chunks, until the meat is brown all over. Season with salt and pepper. Once completely browned add the tomato puree and mix. Cook for two minutes and then pour in the red wine and turn up the heat to bubble the wine. Cook for 3-4 minutes scraping any bits stuck to the bottom of the pan.

#### STEP 3

Add the tomatoes to the pan, mix well and bring to a simmer then pour in 400ml of the stock. Bring to a rapid simmer, reduce the heat to low and leave to cook gently for an hour, stirring every now and again until thickened and reduced. If at any point the mixture looks too dry then add the remaining stock along with a little water. Set to one side while you make the béchamel sauce.

#### STEP 4

Preheat the oven to 19OC/375F/Gas 5. In a medium heavy – based saucepan melt the butter, stir in the flour and cook for 3–4 minutes. Gradually whisk in the milk, but in batches, until smooth. Taste and season as necessary with salt and pepper. Add the nutmeg and then cook over a gentle heat for 4–5 minutes until thickened, stirring now and again.

#### STEP 5

Spread one- third of the meat sauce across the bottom of a medium lasagne dish and top with a quarter of the Bechamel sauce, then cover with lasagne sheets. Repeat the process to create a further 2 layers. Completely cover the top layer of lasagne sheets with the remaining Bechamel sauce. Sprinkle the rest of the Parmesan on top.

#### STEP 6

Place in a preheated oven and bake for 30–40mins or until golden brown and bubbling.
