We have welcomed new workers, volunteers and staff throughout the year; each and every one a valuable member of the team and wider Jennyruth Workshops family.





We have 38 workers who attend both full and parttime. The age range is from 19-59. Daily attendance averages 21 at present and we do have a waiting list.



Alongside hands-on workshop experience, we offer a wide range of training courses to enable our workers to gain independence, new skills, confidence and experience.

Workers get involved with as many aspects of the business as is practically possible; from working in the office alongside our business support team to helping design, make and paint our products with the paintshop and woodwork staff.

They meet customers at stalls and talks, and attend community events as ambassadors of the Workshops regularly.

This year has seen us welcome Angie Shield to the team as a part-time Paintshop Supervisor.











One of our favourite things to see on Social Media is when our customers share photos of the gifts and products we've made them.



They have also been taking on more responsibility in making and editing the magazine.


























How people hear about us.


