
## Workers' World

## Working From Home



During lockdown I have been helping a lot more in the garden and also learnt more about plants and wildlife in the Denise's zoom gardening group. We have had more time to take notice of things outside. We talked about senses of spring;

Sights of spring; flowers and bulbs, lambs, birds nesting, green shoots, seeds growing.

#### Here are some jobs I shall be doing in the garden in spring;


Prune bushes

Because frogs come out in the rain, people used to think that they fell to earth in the rain! And in nineteenth century England, people tried catching them to prove it.




## Cooks' Corner





# Victoria's favourite Chocolate Chip Cookie Recipe

150g Self-Raising Flour
25g Cocoa Powder
110g Butter or Margarine
75g Soft Dark Brown Sugar
2 Tbsp Golden Syrup
110g Chocolate Chips
2 Tbsp Milk



- 1. Preheat oven to fan 160°C.
- 2. Grease 2 baking trays.
- 3. Sift the flour and cocoa together.
- 4. Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 5. Stir in the syrup, flour, cocoa, chocolate chips and milk and mix well.
- 6. Place spoonfuls of the mixture on the prepared trays, flatten slightly and bake for 15–20 minutes.
- 7. Leave to cool for a cuple of minutes, then place cookies on a cooling track to cool.

#### Jamie and Daniel's yummy Easter Biscuit recipe

200 gms [8 ozs] plain flour.

1/2 level teaspoon mixed spice.

100 gms [4 ozs] margarine or butter

100 gms [4 ozs] caster sugar

50 gms [2 ozs] currants

1 large egg

A little extra caster sugar to finish



#### Oven Gas 5 /180 C

#### Method

- 1. Heat oven.
- 2. Grease 2 baking sheets
- 3. Sieve flour and spice. Cut up fat and rub into flour.
- 4. Stir in the sugar, currants and add the beaten egg gradually to give a firm not sticky dough.
- 5. Roll out on floured surface to 1cm thickness and cut into rounds. Sprinkle with sugar and place on trays.
- 6. Bake 15-20 minutes. Cool slightly before removing.

It is tradition on Easter Sunday to give three of these biscuits tied together with coloured ribbon to each member of the family at breakfast time.

## Magdooshka Creates

I am a stained glass artist who aims to introduce more colour, light and movement into gardens and homes. I work in my garden workshop in Ripon making a range of stained glass products for individual customers, galleries and shops, including the National Trust and for sale at the stalls and events as well as at my own 'open studio' weekends and from my website.

Last year I asked Jennyruth Workshops to help me make the cards, I had been painstakingly making myself, which I hang a small stained glass gift onto the front of.

Everyone was so helpful at each stage in the process, the designers really listened to my ideas and worked on the details with me concerning both the type and size of the font to use and on the replication and size of the image of the tree I had been using for a number of years. The workers are now using the amazing laser cutter to cut out the trees on these cards and the information that the cards are made from 100% recycled paper. They have even been keeping and sending me the cut out trees so I can use them on the inside of the cards, as I have always done.

I am so pleased with the result, which saves me so much time to spend on my glass work, at such a reasonable outlay. A brilliant service which maintains the look I want, whilst giving me more time for me to spend on my own glass work.


