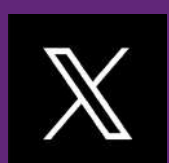

We were all freezing because it was cold inside the building, but the radiators were on to keep us warm.

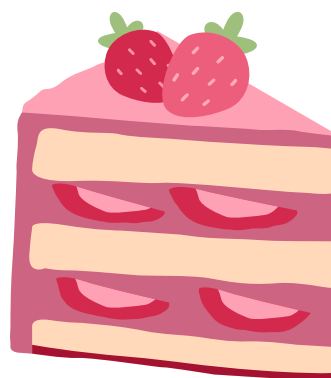

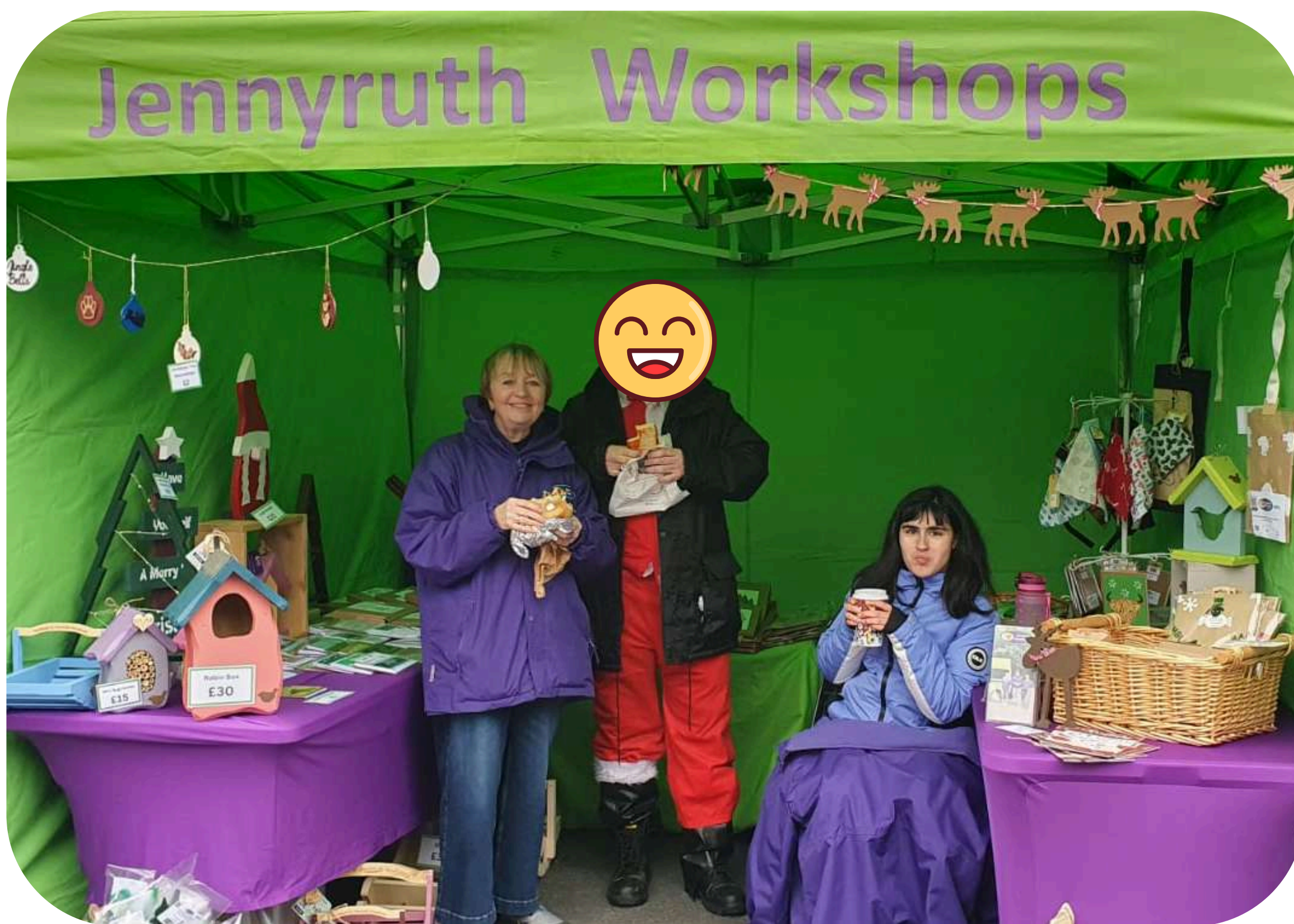
Marton Cum Grafton - Coffee Morning

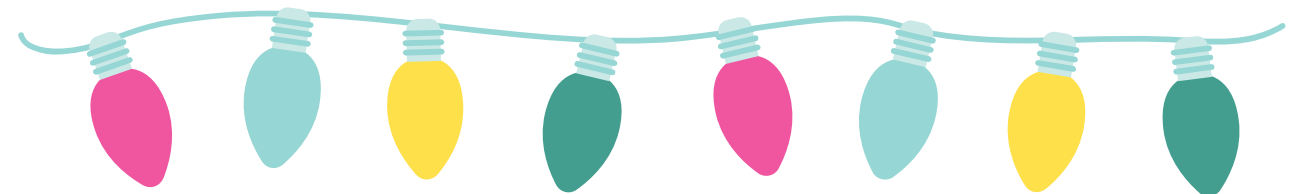


Harrogate Christmas Tree Festival

Osmotherley Coffee Morning



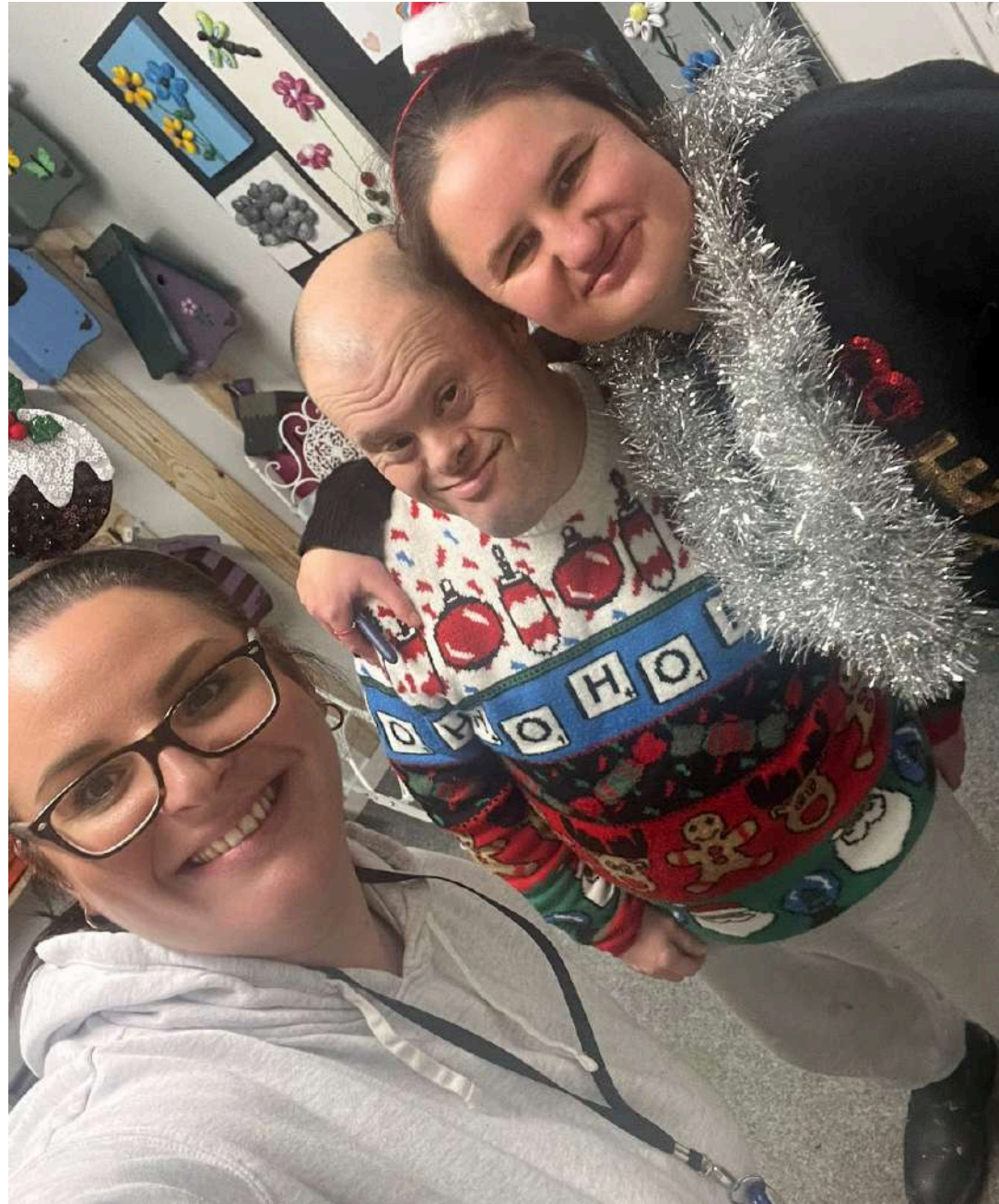

Chris, Dawn and Ben had a lovely festive morning at Hampsthwaite Primary School, they joined in with their Christmas Sing along.

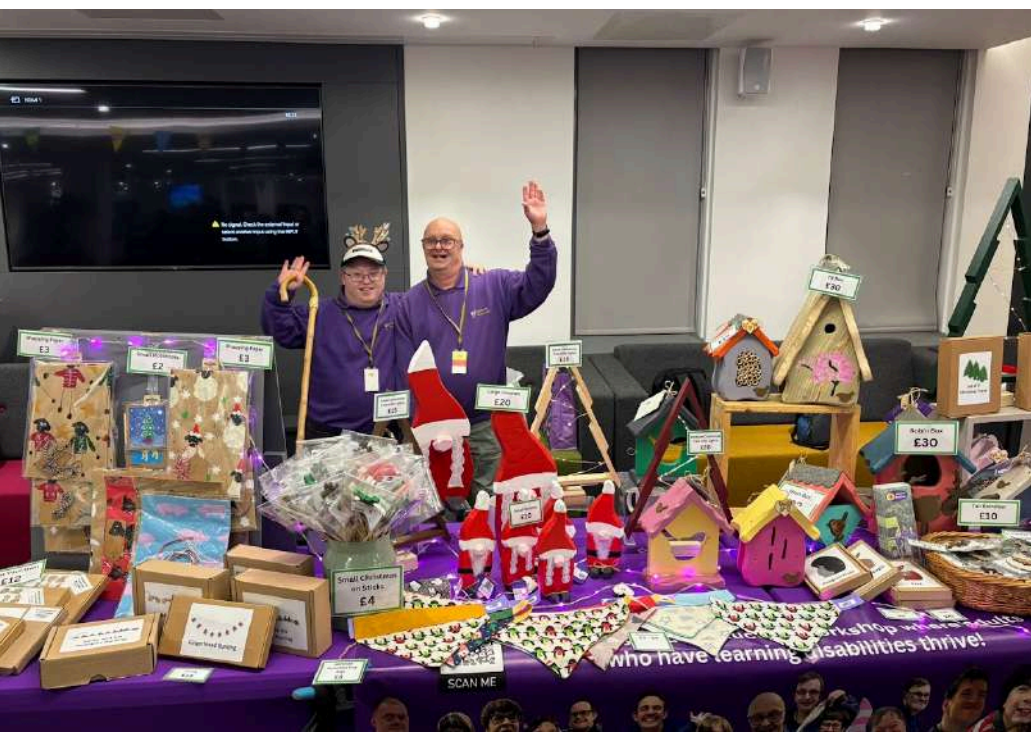
The choir group was amazing, we also joined in with the Makaton song and some dancing.

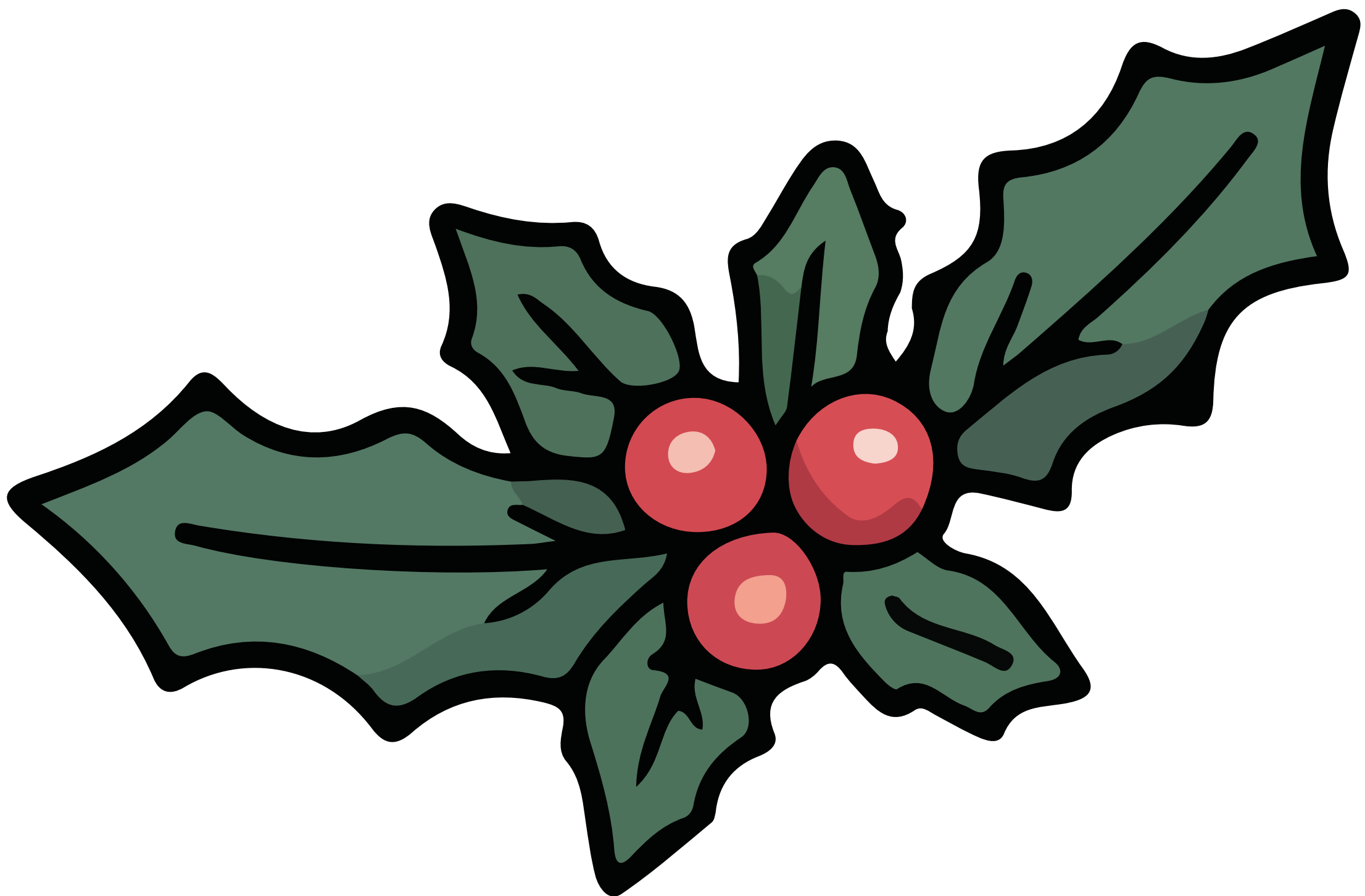

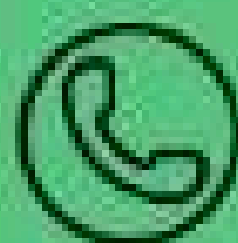
COMMUNITY TRUST

At our centre based in Northalleton, North Yorkshire. We offer sensory sessions for adults and children with additional needs.

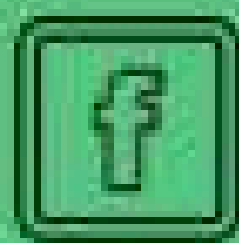
The centre is fully padded and includes a giant soft slide, interactive walls, ball pool, waterbed, bubble tubes and much more for you to explore!

We are fully hoisted and changing facilities located on site as well as a small café serving hot drinks and refreshments.

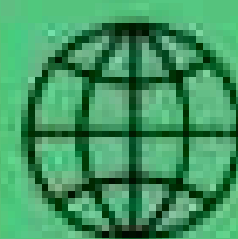

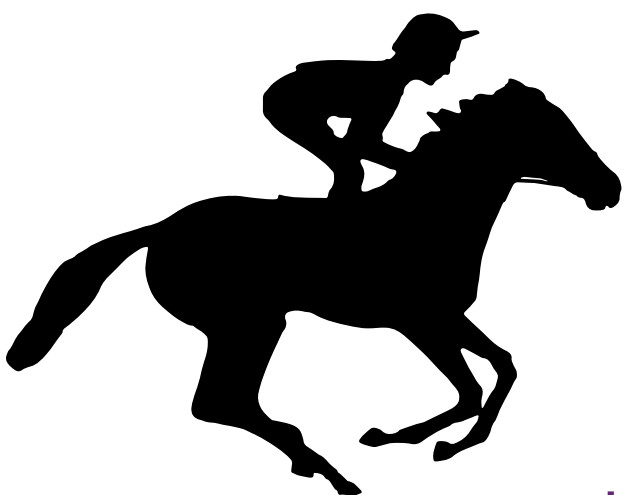
A section dedicated to our fabulously fantastic workers!

I'm just happy being me !



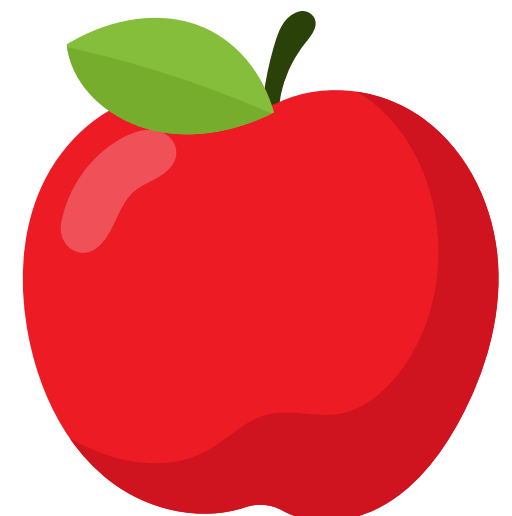
What's your favourite film?
